Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends,

The Hereworth Community has always impressed me with their dedication and support for events run at the school.

The recent Gala was a tremendous success and is a key calendar event that runs on a biennial basis. The intent behind it is to primarily bring the wider Hawke's Bay community together to share in a fundraising event for Hereworth School.

A big thank you to everyone for their support last Sunday. The event was exceptionally well attended and it was wonderful as the Headmaster to see the support of so many families from the community on our grounds. The money raised will be used to cover some of the renovation work undertaken on our swimming pool.

This year, the final sum of money raised was a highly impressive \$49,000 and this is a new record for the Gala. Kate de Lautour coordinated the event and was supported by a large number of parents and volunteers who helped to prepare for the 2016 Gala. Meetings were held on a regular basis and it was encouraging to see so many parents helping with a lengthy list of tasks that was growing by the day.

Marketing of the event was a key task and we took advantage of several opportunities to entice the Hawke's



Bay community to attend. Through the use of signs, poster, newspaper features and even a Breeze radio station interview, there was a lot of promotional opportunities exploited.

On the day, the gala featured both a record number of external stalls selling everything from fresh meat, cakes, toys, bric-a-brac, crafted artifacts and personalised cricket bats. An art auction also featured where work from prominent artists were available to bid on. Some excitable moments occurred during the auction as individuals battled to win the items on offer. The public were also able to have rides in vintage vehicles, play classic games such as the tombola and could even take the opportunity to throw wet sponges at Hereworth's Headmaster!

I felt very proud walking around the Gala knowing how many people had decided to support our event and at the same time visit our beautiful school. A big thank you to everyone who was involved with the Gala and I look forward to seeing what can be achieved in 2018.

In addition to the Gala, the community also supported our

Grandparents' Day. With over 150 people in attendance, this was a wonderful opportunity for Grannies, Grandads and even a few Great Grandparents to see our boys in action. The day began with a service by Reverend Rosemary Carey that meant the Chapel was filled to capacity. Both Satoko and Haruka were suitably impressed with the inquisitiveness, interest and eagerness of our boys.

Along with Satoko and Haruka, a big 'domou arigatou' to Joe Rush (IPU) who was instrumental in assisting with this beneficial visit to Hereworth School to encourage and support Japanese Language and Culture.
